Do you think you could improve the student classroom experience? The Arts and Sciences Support of Education Through Technology (ASSETT) team is looking to hire Student Technology Consultants (STCs). A Student Technology Consultant enjoys diving into problems faculty and students are facing in the classroom, learning about what technologies would be able to help, and sorting through that information to recommend the best course of action.

Student Technology Consultants are a student perspective for Arts & Sciences faculty who are interested in leveraging technology to provide the best educational experience for their students. Typically, an STC discusses the classroom objectives with interested faculty member on a one-on-one basis, strategizes ways of meeting those objectives, and demo applicable technology tools to decide which is right for the job. The Student Technology Consultant may then provide in-class support or otherwise instruct faculty and students on how they should use that tool.

STCs are also trained to assist the Visualizing Instructional Practices Service (VIPS) by observing classes to collect objective observation data. Finally, the Student Technology Consultants support the ASSETT mission by helping ASSETT staff with various education and technology-related projects.

This is an undergraduate hourly position for 8-10 hours per week, starting at \$15 per hour.

The ideal candidate will have:

- The ability to notice, diagnose, and provide solutions to classroom problems
- Strong interpersonal skills
- The ability to work independently and within a team
- Strong verbal and written communication skills
- The ability to learn new technologies quickly

Having experience with media communication—writing articles, video editing, podcasting, digital literacy, digital identity, and web design—is a huge plus.
